# Code of Conduct for Players, Parents / Spectators and Managers

## Players Code of Conduct

### Your duty towards the game

#### A player should:

- Make every effort to develop their own sporting abilities, in terms of skill, technique, tactics and stamina.
- Give maximum effort and strive for the best possible performance during a game, whether the team is winning well or losing heavily.
- Set a positive example for others, particularly younger players and supporters.
- Avoid all forms of gamesmanship, and timewasting.
- Always have the best interests of the game at heart, including when expressing your views on the game and the way it is run or refereed.
- Not to use bad or foul language.
- Take time to read and conform with the FA Respect campaign that can be view on the FA website at: <http://www.thefa.com/Respect>

### Your duty towards the Club

#### A player should:

- Know that, while representing the club he/she should behave in a sensible manner.
- Make every effort to attend each training session.
- In the event that a training session cannot be attended, prior notice should be given to the team coach with the reason why.
- Respect the decisions of the coaches and managers.
- Always listen to the coaches and managers when they are giving direction and advice.
- Feel free to ask their manager or coach for an explanation when unsure what is being asked of them.

### Duty towards one's own team

#### A player should:

- Always behave in a sensible manner and not cause any disruption during training sessions or at matches.
- Make every effort to play fair and obey the Laws of the game to help his own team win.
- Resist any behaviour on or off the pitch that might affect his team winning the match.

### Respect for the Laws of the Game and Competition Rules

#### A player should:

- Know and abide by the Laws, rules and spirit of the game, and the competition rules.
- Accept success and failure, victory and defeat, equally.
- Resist any temptation to take banned substances or use banned techniques.

### Respect towards Opponents

#### A player should:

- Treat opponents with due respect at all times, irrespective of the result of the game.
- Safeguard the physical fitness of opponents, avoid violence and rough play, and help injured opponents.

### Respect towards the Match Officials

#### A player should:

- Accept the decision of the Match Official without protest.
- Avoid words or actions which may mislead a Match Official.
- Show due respect towards Match Officials.

### Respect towards Team Officials

#### A player should:

- Follow the instructions of the Coach and Team Officials, provided they do not go against the spirit of this Code.
- Show due respect towards the Team Officials of the opposition.

## Duty towards the Supporters

### A player should:

- Show due respect to the interests of supporters.

## Any proven breach of the Code of Conduct will be dealt with by the Club / League Disciplinary Committee in accordance with the rules of the League

## Parents / Spectators Code of Conduct

- Parents / Spectators must appreciate children's involvement in playing football should be primarily for his/her personal enjoyment.
- Parents / Spectators must respect the rights, dignity and worth of each and every person and treat them equally within the contexts of sport.
- Praise positive aspects of play and avoid becoming frustrated or ridiculing young players by focusing on their failings.
- Parents / Spectators must place the wellbeing and safety of each player above all considerations, including the development of performance.
- Parents / Spectators must adhere to all guidelines laid down within the constitution and rules of the FA and the Football League that their team is playing in.
- Parents must develop an appropriate supportive relationship with both manager and their child, based on mutual trust and respect.
- Parents must not exert undue influence to obtain personal benefit or reward.
- Parents / Spectators must encourage and guide players to accept responsibility for their own behaviour and performance.
- Parents / Spectators should at the outset and where appropriate, seek clarification with the manager, Club and players, exactly what is expected of them and also what they are entitled to expect in return.
- Parents must co-operate fully with specialist (e.g. other managers, officials, sports scientists, doctors, physiotherapists) as it is in their interests to comply.
- Parents / Spectators must always promote the positive aspects of sport (e.g. fair play) and never condone violations of the laws of the game, behaviour contrary to the spirit of the laws of the game, behaviour contrary to the spirit of the game or relevant rules and regulations including racist or homophobic comments or the use of prohibited substances or techniques.
- Parents / Spectators must consistently display high standards of behaviour and must, at all times, refrain from arguing with the Referee and Assistant Referees or Linesmen.
- Parents / Spectators must emphasise the importance of striving to win, not winning itself.
- Praise effort and performance more than results.
- Parents / Spectators must, at all times, show respect for the management and coaches, all officials, the opposition and their supporters. This includes referees and linesmen.
- Parents / Spectators shall read and conform with the FA Respect campaign that can be view on the FA website at: <http://www.thefa.com/Respect>
- The use of violent conduct, foul language and abusive language is strictly forbidden.
- Parents / Spectators are forbidden to enter the field of play during a match, unless by specific request from the referee.
- Any Parents / Spectators wishing to take photographs or recording footage must request the permission of both team managers prior to doing so.
- A Club is responsible for the behaviour of its parents, spectators and Club officials at all matches.

- Parents will be responsible or the payment of any fine imposed upon them or their son/daughter by the FA or Football League.
- Payment will be submitted to the Bookham Colts League Secretary upon request, in line with the deadlines imposed.

## Managers Code of Conduct

### I will:

- Show respect to others involved in the game including match officials, opposition players, Coaches, managers, officials and spectators.
- Adhere to the Laws of the Game.
- Display and promote high standards of Behaviour.
- Always respect the match officials' decisions.
- Never enter the field of play without the referee's permission.
- Never engage in public criticism of the match officials.
- Never engage in, or tolerate, offensive, insulting or abusive language or behaviour.

### When working with players, I will:

- Place the well-being, safety and enjoyment of each player above everything, including Winning.
- Explain exactly what I expect of players and what they can expect from me.
- Refrain from the use of foul language and abusive language.
- Ensure the parents/carers of all players under the age of 18 understand these expectations.
- Refrain from, and refuse to tolerate any form of bullying.
- Develop mutual trust and respect with every player to build their self-esteem.
- Encourage each player to accept responsibility for their own behaviour and performance.
- Ensure all activities I organise are appropriate for the players' ability level, experience, age and maturity.
- Co-operate fully with others in football (e.g. officials, doctors, physiotherapists, welfare officers) for each player's best interests.

## I understand that breaches of the code of conduct may result in action being taken by my County FA and /or The FA.

## Club Fees
